

Yamaha S90 XS / S70 XS Editor Standalone/VST V1.6.8 for Windows Release Notes

Attention

If the S90 XS / S70 XS Editor VST under V1.4.0 has already been installed to your computer, uninstall that version of the editor before installing this version.

Main Revisions and Enhancements

V1.6.3 -> V1.6.8

- Now supports Cubase 9.5 series.
- Now Cubase 6, 7, 8 series are NON-compliant.
- Solved a problem in which the application might be forced to quit occasionally when using the 64 bit PC.
- Fixed some minor problems.

Known Issues

- After re-installation of the Editor, the Voice name may occasionally not appear on the Media Bay windows of Cubase. If this is the case, execute "Refresh" or "Rescan".
- The Mixing setup may not be recalled even if you store the current data of the Multi mode to a different Multi number then select the original Multi number again. To prevent such a situation, select another Multi number on the Editor, then select the original Multi number, or select the original Multi number directly from the S90 XS instrument again.

Minimum System Requirements

- Note that the system requirements may be slightly different from those described below depending on the particular computer.

Installing the application

1. After the downloaded compressed file is properly extracted, double-click a following file.

Install S90 XS _ S70 XS Editor Standalone_VST.exe

2. Follow the on-screen instructions to install the software.

For users of Windows 10

Starting the application:

Click “All apps” in the Start menu to see the full list of applications. You can start the application by clicking the icon.

For users of Windows 8

Starting the application:

Once the application is successfully installed, an icon of the application will be in your Windows 8 Start screen. You can start the application by clicking the icon.

NOTE

If the icon is not listed, right-click an empty area of the Start screen and select “All apps.” Then select the application icon from the application list.

Uninstalling the application:

1. Right-click the application you wish to remove in the Windows 8 Start screen. If it's not listed, right click an empty area of the screen and select “All apps.”
2. A check will be placed on the application you selected. Select the “Uninstall” option that appears at the bottom of the screen.

- Solved the problem in which the insertion effect of the part might be changed to off when initializing the mixing settings or part settings with the insertion effect of the AD part on.
- Solved the problem in which the "All" type file of the MOTIF XS (extension: X0A) could not be imported to the S90 XS / S70 XS Editor VST when using the 64 bit version of Cubase.
- Solved the problem in which clicking the [Cancel] button of the Multi data select window would set the insertion effects of all parts to off when opening the "All" type file of the S90 XS / S70 XS (extension: X2A) in the S90 XS / S70 XS Editor VST.
- Solved some minor problems.

<New Features>

- Now supports Cubase 5.5 series.

<Fixed Bugs>

- Solved a problem in which the save operation might fail when you select "Save As..." after selecting "New" from the File menu.
- Solved a problem in which Cubase is forced to quit when you close the Editor window during the Import operation when in the ONLINE status.
- Solved a problem in which Cubase might be forced to quit occasionally when MIDI data is played back with the Editor window open.
- Solved a problem in which the VSTi settings of the Editor might not be restored when opening a Project file of Cubase.
- Solved a problem in which the entire volume might be lowered to 0 when changing the mode from the Editor.
- Solved a problem in which Cubase is forced to quit when clicking the close box of the Editor window repeatedly.
- Minor bug fixes.

V1.2.2 -> V1.3.0

<New Features>

- Now supports Windows 7.
- Now supports Cubase 5.1.
- Reduced the launching time of the Editor.
- Synchronization between Cubase, Editor and the S90 XS / S70 XS instrument has been improved, enabling you to make edits more smoothly and quickly. From this version, both the Editor and S90 XS / S70 XS instrument are changed to the Voice mode automatically regardless of the current mode by calling up the VST preset as Voice data from the MediaBay of Cubase or the Editor.

- **[NOTICE]**

The above operation will erase the currently edited settings of the Editor and S90 XS / S70 XS instrument.

<Fixed Bugs>

- Solved a problem in which a sound would sustain while using the Virtual Keyboard of Cubase.
- Solved a problem in which the Editor would not communicate with the instrument properly when connecting your computer to the instrument using a USB cable, even though the MIDI settings of the Editor Setup were correct.
- Solved a problem in which the Editor could not synchronize with the instrument properly when loading the data that you had saved in the Voice mode of the Editor while the currently selected mode of the instrument was something other than the Voice mode.
- Minor bug fixes.
